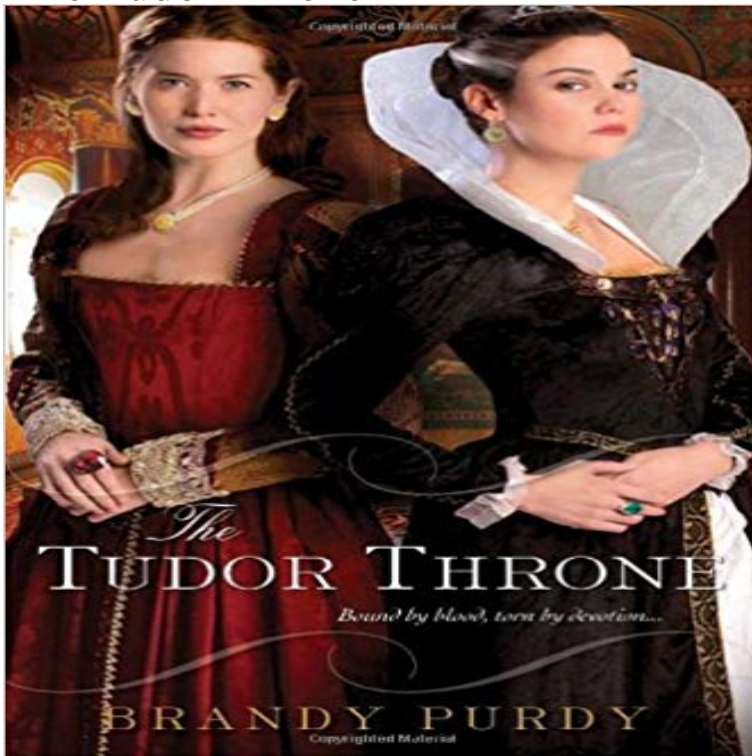


The Tudor Throne
