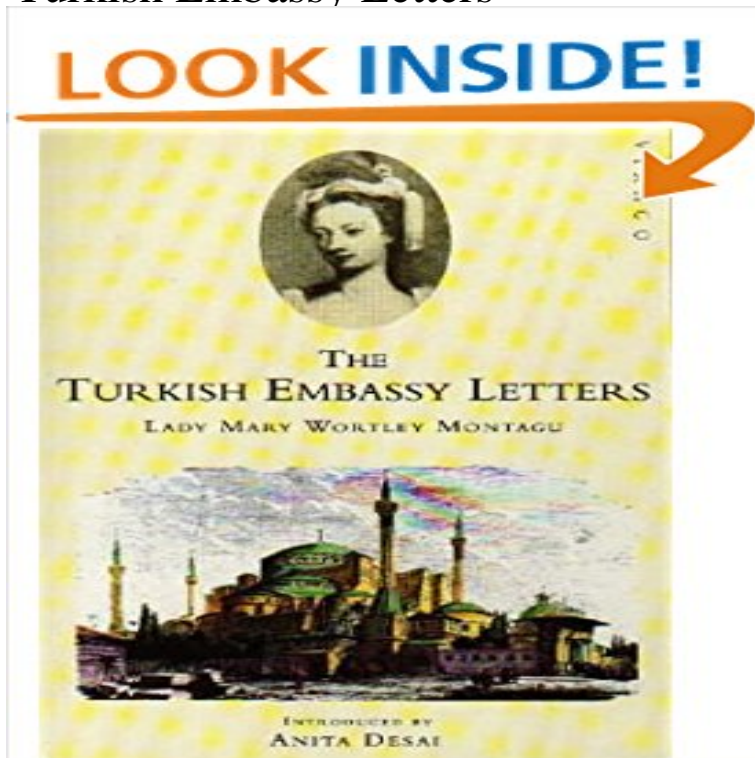


Turkish Embassy Letters
