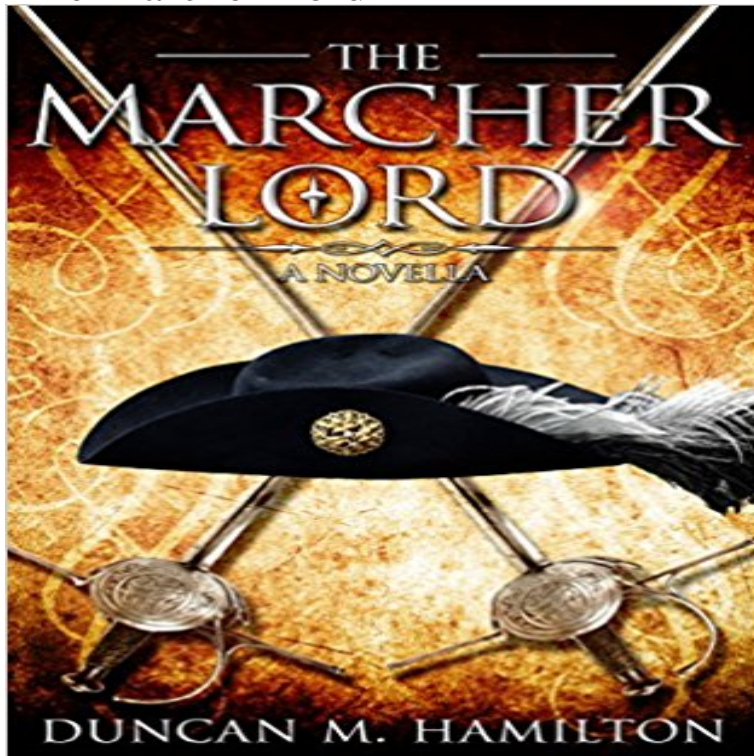


The Marcher Lord
