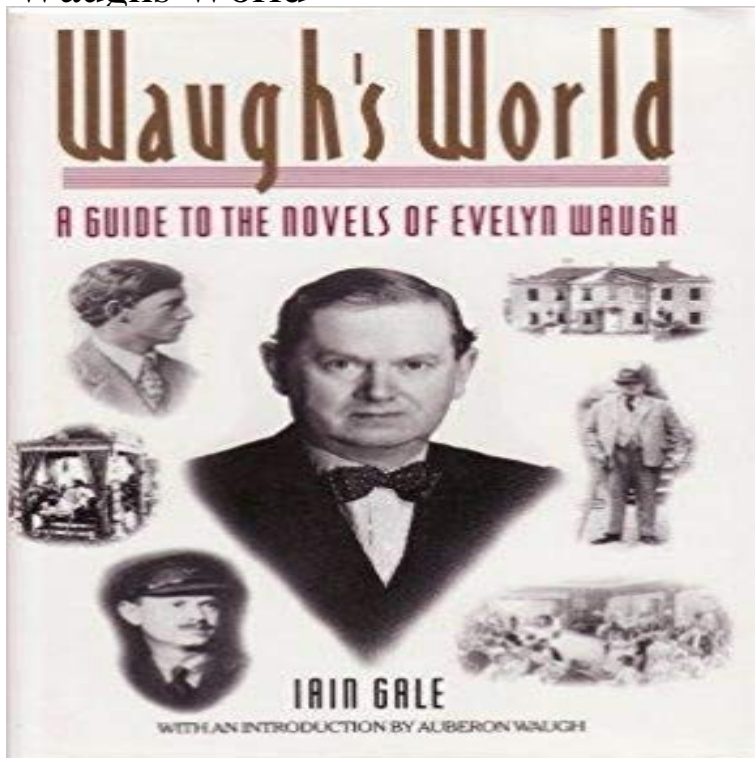


Waugh's World
